



Call for Educational Proposals Guidelines

OVERVIEW

OHCA 2019, to be held April 29 – May 2, 2019 in Columbus, Ohio, is an inclusive opportunity for all current and future Association members in the long-term care services and supports profession to engage in exceptional learning experiences that help to advance the quality of care they provide.

OHCA is seeking proposals that reflect sound adult learning principles and feature expert faculty. To deliver exceptional learning experiences, preference may be given to proposals that are positioned to deliver a mix of the following:

Content:

- Reflect innovative, cutting-edge content and evidence-based practice
- Present a scenario with evidence supported by research or data
- Explore issues important to assisted living communities and providers of services to people with developmental disabilities

Instructional Design:

- Stimulate and provoke discussion, audience engagement and outcome-focused content
- Demonstrates relevance of presentation through “real-life” case studies
- Panel presentations featuring professional staff from SNF, AL, ID/DD settings and services in addition to consultants

Audience:

HOW MANY APPLICATIONS CAN BE SUBMITTED

The committee encourages proposals from different companies and organizations representing different points of view. However, due to the large number of applications received we can only accept two (2) applications from any one speaker and five (5) from any company. Exceptions to the limit will be given for applications that are **solely** focused for assisted living communities or providers of services to people with intellectual and developmental disabilities

- ◇ In an effort to keep registration fees at a minimum for attendees, the convention operates on a limited speaker budget. Therefore, speakers who will waive any request for fees will be given top priority. Keep in mind, however, that OHCA strives to have an expert panel of speakers and does not select speakers solely based on the fact that they will waive honorariums, however, should a topic be submitted by a speaker who will waive their fee they will receive priority.

Expenses: Speakers are provided reimbursement for travel related expenses including airfare, mileage and meal for the day of their presentation. Overnight room accommodations are provided for out of state speakers as well as first morning session speakers. Speakers willing to donate their travel expenses will also receive priority. Keep in mind, however, that OHCA strives to have an expert panel of speakers and does not select speakers solely based on the fact that they will waive honorariums and travel reimbursements.
